Eg. Tom Thumb flies a kite, I spy Snow White

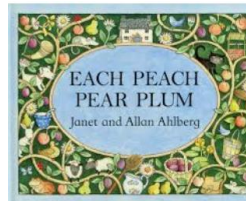
Humpty Dumpty in the mud, I spy Red Riding Hood

Maths Challenge 1

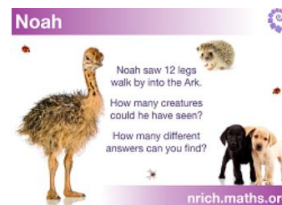
Always, Sometimes or Never true? Convince me!

Can you count forwards AND backwards?

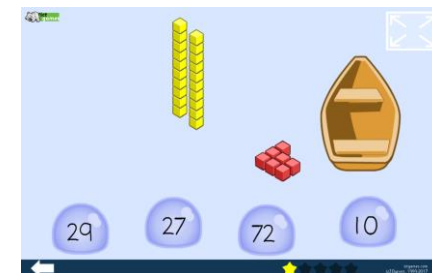
Can you start from any number?

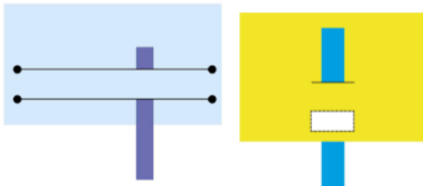
Art and Design & Technology Challenge
