Try to include a short explanation of what the invention is and why it features in your Top 5. Remember to read back through your work to check for spelling and punctuation.</p>	<p>Based on all the inventions you have looked at throughout the week, select your favourite one.</p> <p>Imagine you have been asked to create an advertisement to sell this invention on the TV, in a similar way to <i>Shouty Man on Horrible Histories</i>.
