WELCOME BACK!

Welcome back to all our wonderful pupils and families for the start of another new school year at Overton St Helen's. It's at this time of the year that I really notice time passing, seeing certain children moving up through the school, sitting further back in the worship hall and baby brothers and sister who were seemingly in prams only a short while ago now starting in our Reception Class. However, it is equally wonderful to see our young people growing and maturing, becoming ready for new challenges and added responsibility. It was great to see everyone again after our summer break and I am pleased to share with you that every pupil has made a good start and has settled back to the school routine, despite the heat! In order to support our children in making a positive start, as a school we have focused on five clear expectations for attitude and behaviour: walking inside, quite voices, use of good language, good listening and showing kindness. We agree that these five expectations will help create a calm and positive learning environment in which to work and play.

PE LESSONS

PE lessons have begun this week for most classes, however next week they will continue in a more routined way. Each of our classes have two PE lessons a week, as per expectations set out in the National Curriculum. If your child is in Holly, Elm, Willow, Beech or Oak Class, pupils should come to school in PE kit on the days when they have PE lessons. Only pupils in Maple Class should bring PE kit to school in a bag, for it to be kept here during each half-term—their PE days can be more flexible. School PE kit should consist of: coloured PE t-shirts according to the colour house each pupil belongs to, dark shorts, track suit bottoms or leggings and a school jumper. PE kits or branded sports wear is not acceptable. Earrings need to be removed on PE days. Below are the days when each class have PE:

Holly: Tuesday & Thursday Elm: Wednesday & Thursday Willow: Monday & Friday Beech: Monday & Friday Oak:: Tuesday & Thursday

It is important to note that for WILLOW Class, Monday's PE session is their swimming lesson. Therefore, on Monday Willow Class should come in their normal school uniform, bringing their swimming kit with them.

ARRIVING LATE FOR SCHOOL

Each morning, school registration is at 8.30am. Our KS2 class room doors open at 8.20am and from that time, children are welcome to walk round to their classrooms. At 8.25am KS1 class teachers open their doors to welcome the children inside. If you arrive after 8.30am the classroom doors will be closed and you need to enter via the front door, where you will need to sign in your child. Starting the day at the correct time with the class as a whole makes a huge difference to a child's day, so I would please urge you to be as punctual as possible. Thank you.

ARRIVING AT SCHOOL

On the subject of arriving for school, this week we noticed a small group of our Year 6 pupils hanging around at the front gate after being dropped off, instead of coming straight on to the school playground. For their own safety and because we have no member of staff on duty at the front of the school, please ensure that if you drop your child off, they know to go directly onto the playground.
